
We Have a STAR Portrait Artist Coming this Fall!

Name that Painting

Now that your painting is finished, what will you name it? Sometimes it's very obvious and simple: *Birds Flying South*, *George's Coffee Break*, or *Oranges and Apples*. You can picture what these paintings might look like. More often, you need to think about a name that's not just a description; something more clever.

How do you come up with a name that identifies the painting, but isn't just a basic description? Here's what some artists say in an article from *Artists Network*:

Sometimes I know the title of a work before I begin, but mostly I find little phrases out in the world and collect them into an 'Orphan Titles' document. When a painting needs a title, I go to my list and find the one that clicks." —Julie Beck

"The title is in the story. I look for the story and there is always a story. Sometimes the story comes before the artwork. Sometimes it takes me by surprise and comes in the middle of creating. The story can even evolve days after the image is finished"—Louise Reading

"Naming art is a lot like naming a puppy. You need to sit with it and get to know its personality before you christen it. The process I use begins with yellow legal pads in the studio, house and car. I jot down words, phrases, titles, poems and conversations—things I hear or things I read. I have a running list of probably 5,000 potential titles." —Beverly Todd

Whether you keep a list of potential titles or not, most artists want a more creative name for their painting. I don't usually have a title before I start a painting; I wait until it's finished. A good title can help sell your painting or convince a judge to look at it more carefully.

There's no right or wrong. Assigning a name to a piece you've spent hours on is part of an artist's job, so approach it with joy and you might even like that painting better than before.




Call for Art

Artist Exhibitor Applications Open

Attention artists! Applications are now open for artist exhibitors at the 4th annual South Main Arts Festival, a juried and curated artistic event in celebration of the Month of the Arts in Georgetown, TX.

Artist exhibitors have the opportunity to apply for a 10x10 booth space to exhibit and sell artwork. Mediums accepted into the festival include ceramics/pottery, drawing, fiber art, glass art, jewelry, leather art, metalwork, mixed media, painting, photography, and woodworking.

If you are interested in on-line tutorials, live and recorded, check out <https://terracotta.art>. Terracotta focuses only on watercolor and has artists from all over the world. Demonstrations tend to be two to three hours on zoom and they have at least one a week on various topics: florals, birds, landscape, urbanscapes, snow scenes, water ... Reference images are usually available in advance of the class and you can paint along if you want. There is always a moderator who helps with technical issues,

monitors the chat, etc. Most artists are happy to take questions while they are working. Terracotta offers various levels of subscriptions which give you access to recordings for various lengths of times. They have a gallery where subscribers can post their own work. One subscription includes feedback from a professional. Check it out!
